All prices include Marek's & Coccidiosis vaccinations (where applicable), and include in-store care (poul-vite, pasty-butt treatment, etc) for up to 5 days from delivery from hatchery. There are NO additional shipping charges or taxes.

Once picked up, there are no guarantees for health or survivability.

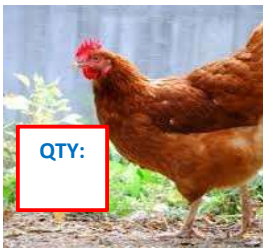

SEX-SAL-LINK BROWN: These chickens are easy to raise and are prolific producers of large, richly-colored brown eggs of excellent shell quality. They are quiet and friendly and easily trained to lay in their nests. They are also very clean in their nests so nesting material will last a lot longer! These chickens are a great layer and a friendly bird.

WHITE LEGHORN: These chickens are ideal for the production of large, high quality, white eggs. White Leghorns are bred for their disease resistance, excellent feed conversion, and are easily adapted to most conditions. They are early maturing and are noted for their lack of broodiness. White Leghorns are highly recommended for any size of flock.

RED ROCK CROSS: The traditional cross is a fine balance between egg and meat production. Roosters resemble a Barred Rock in size by weighing in at 6.5 lbs. while the trim black hen with reddish chest weighs in at 5.5 lbs.

RED SUSSEX CROSS: This heavy breed cross will give you a high bred vigor - early maturity - good egg production - and large body size birds. There is an excellent balance between good meat, decent eggs and a very easy to handle and raise flock. Pullets will weigh in at 5.5 lbs. at maturity.

RHODE ISLAND RED: This is one of the most famous and all time popular chicken breeds. Developed in the early part of this century in the state of the same name, they have maintained their reputation as a dual purpose fowl through the years. No other heavy breed lays more or better eggs than the Rhode Island Reds. Baby chicks are a rusty red color and the mature birds are a variety of mahogany red.

COLUMBIAN ROCK: These remain one of the heaviest dual purpose chickens. They are a great choice for an all around bird with their sweet happy-go-lucky personality. Very good meat birds - lean, tasty, and hardy. Keep a few over the winter for a fresh supply of eggs.

BARRED PLYMOUTH ROCK: The Barred Plymouth Rock is one of the oldest pure breeds. These are tasty, fat-free birds, expected to produce up to 300 eggs. They are easy to raise, and are winter hardy; however, they are the most difficult breed to sex.
